Letter to the Editor

Sir.

"Charley's Corner" in the December issue of THE CZECHOSLOVAK SPECIALIST discussed the Heydrich miniature sheet. From the historical angle there were a few errors that should be corrected for the benefit of any persons who would want to refer to it in their annotated stamp collections, if not also for the historical truth itself.

- 1: The "Reichsprotector," (the executioner of the Czechs), Reinhard Heydrich, was being driven at a leisurely speed in his open Mercedes-Benz car by an ISS chauffeur. The execution took place just after the car made a very sharp—more than 90 degrees—turn, definitely an impossible automobile operation at "high speed" as suggested.
- 2: The execution was carried out by Sergeants Gabčík and Kubiš, both members of the Czechoslovak Armed Forces Abroad, who were sent to Prague

for that specific task by the Czechoslovak Government in Exile in England.

3: Heydrich was not machine-gunned, but was injured by a bomb blast; he died in the hospital from the injuries that were aggravated by the horse-hair imbedded in his kidneys as the seats in the luxury car disintegrated from the force of the bomb explosion.

For clarification it has to be added that one of the executioners jumped in front of the car with an English Sten-gun, intending to stop the slow-moving car or to machine-gun the occupants, but the weapon did not fire: it is possible that in that highly emotional moment the Sten-gun was not completely locked as required for it to function. At this point Heydrich was still in the car with his pistol drawn when the bomb thrown from behind the car rolled under the car and exploded. Heydrich staggered out of the car intending to shoot, but collapsed. The uninjured chauffeur actually exchanged some gunfire with the executioners.

Hopefully Mr. Chesloe will accept these minor corrections of this historic event because I was closely connected to the event in several ways at the time of its occurrance.

Also by way of warning collectors, there are many so-called "Heydrica sheets" on the market, which are not the one described by Mr. Chesloe. Many "souvenir sheets," with or without the portrait of Heydrich were produced after the Heydrich stamp was issued, the stamp then being pasted to the sheet; these were sold to the public by the thousands. Some enterpreneurs even added numbers to these sheets later on and trid to sell them as the real "Heydrich sheets." Whether or not this is merely a semantic difference or an outright lie, caveat emptor: they're worth between 50c and \$1.00 each, as opposed to the very expensive miniature sheet specially printed for the occasion, as described by Charlie. Happy hunting!

Hidden Engravers' Marks on Czechoslovak Stamps

The hidden engravers' marks on Czechoslovak stamps have interested me for many years, and I have exhibited them at several stamp shows of THE CZECHOSLOVAK PHILATELIC SOCIETY. Most of them are the initials of the engraver, and during the First Republic from 1918 to 1939 there are really only two of any great importance, namely, those of Karel Seizinger and those of Bohumil Heinz.

Karel Seizinger, who engraved most of the stamps of the First Republic, marked his work primarily with the letter "S", but several examples of the letters "KS" are to be found. A randomness of positioning his "S" is certainly characteristic of his work regardless of whether it was right forward, horizontal or reversed on the face of the stamp; the third setting is, of course, the hardest to find.

Bohumil Heinz identified his engravings usually with his initials "BH", but in some cases it is found spelled out entirely as "HEINZ".

The work of both engravers has been rather fully described in the philatelic literature, and needs little additional discussion here for collectors of Czechoslovak stamps.

Very few of the stamps between 1918 and 1928 have engravers' marks, but among the stamps issued to mark the 10th Anniversary of Czechoslovak Independence there is clear evidence that two stamps of the 10-stamp issue included engravers' marks. From this set onward, engravers' marks were standard procedure for most Czechoslovak stamps. From 1937 onward the name of the artist was added to the stamps, the engraver's name being printed below the stamp design on the right, and the artists' name on the left.

Since the appearance of Ladislav Novotný's SPECIAL HANDBOOK FOR COLLECTORS OF CZECHOSLOVAK STAMPS in 1970, I have tried to compile a list of the so-called secret marks of the stamps of the First Republic. I believe that the HANDBOOK lists some but not all of them, so am taking the liberty of listing those noted by Novotný and some more that I have found in the hope that other collectors will add to the list from time to time. In the following list the asterisk (*) next to the Novotný catalog number indicates that the HANDBOOK lists the engraver's mark.



We shall now return to expert marks, which is a continuation of our corner in the February issue. We must also make a correction in that Erwin Hirsch and Jaroslav Franěk were NOT brothers-in-law. Franěk was married to the daughter of another prominent dealer of the earlier period, Antonín Černý, whose expert mark will be shown at a later date.

Figure 1 shows several signatures. From left to right: Felix Brunner (in pencil), Lešetický, Tribuna, Franěk, and "Lý" meaning Lešetický.

Figure 2 shows KAP in an oval. This is the mark of Karel Kaplánek, noted Prague dealer.

In Figure 3 we again note Kaplánek, Gilbert, Bloch (in pencil), and the fancy "LU" which stands for Lešetický-Ústředna, i.e. Lešetický Committee.

Figure 4 shows the familiar Lý for Lešetický. The other two marks at the middle bottom represent the New York stamp firm of J. and H. Stolow.


Figure 5, reading from left to right: Jan Mrňák, Tribuna, Pofis (Czechoslovak Government stamp monopoly), and Franěk. The "ČERNÝ" in the lower light corner means black in Czech—in this case indicating "black overprint"—rather than Franěk's father-in-law.
