EDITORIAL

Some time ago we warned our members that due to the big increases in printing costs of the Specialist it may be necessary to increase the membership dues. The cost increase was bigger than we anticipated, but we can see our way clear if we increase our dues by approximately 100%, the first increase since the society was organized in 1939. From now on the tariff of membership dues is as follows:

Regular membership, \$2.00 per year; Associate membership, \$5.00 per year; Patron membership, \$10.00 per year and a new "LIFE MEMBERSHIP" \$75.00 for the duration. The "Life Membership" dues shall be invested in U. S. Government G Bonds and the interest from these shall be used toward the payment of dues. When the Life Member has departed this vale of tears, the treasurer is empowered to sell such security and enter it into the general fund. This, of course, is subject to reconsideration at the next election of officers which takes place some time during 1952. The suggestion for Life Membership came from Arthur Kessler who always had the interest of the Society at heart even if he was often too busy to help us as we wished. At present Art is somewhere in Europe and part of his trip is devoted to the betterment of your Specialist. That Art's mission may be successful is the wish, hope and prayer of your editor. If the mission is a success and the treasury shows a substantial increase in vitality, the members will realize it by the contents.

Several new members have written to the editor for back copies of the Specialist. Your editor wants all members to know that back copies can be obtained from Mr. Emil Zaludek, 5737 So. Francisco Ave., Chicago, Ill. All issues to May 1951 at 10c; all later issues at 20c. Non-members pay 100% more.

Number of pages of the Specialist. Our printer's form is made up in multiples of 8 pages. As a result, our printer can print the Specialist in 8, 16, 24, 32, etc., pages cheaper than in pages differing from the above. Our norm has been 12 pages. If the Specialist is printed in 16 pages this month and 8 pages the next month, we can continue our 12 page program. If, as a result of the new, increased membership rates we do not lose more than 10% of our members, it is possible to accept this (16 and 8 page) schedule and maintain it. The rest is entirely up to the members. We have tried hard to maintain the \$1.00 minimum dues; from now this is impossible.

We are sure that many of our members have received the POFIS 1951 CATALOG by now. We especially want to call their attention to prices for stamps issued since the Communist Regime came into power. The prices for

Czecho stamps are normal up to the UPU issue. Due to the immense popularity of all UPU stamps, the price listed for these shows a healthy 100% increase. The really interesting price increases begin with the 1949 Miners' Issue where the 3.Kcs stamp in mint condition is listed at 70.Kcs. From then on the cock-eyed prices continue. Out of every issue one or two stamps in mint condition can be bought only from POFIS; those sold in the Post Office must be placed immediately on the mail and cancelled. Thus, while the Czech philatelic (?) press complains about the capitalistic dealers who, "without working" make tremendous gains on stamps, POFIS, the People's Monopolistic Society, is charging more, much more, than any respectable capitalist dealer would dare. When the Society will be in a position to publish its handbook, these stamps with artificially inflated prices will be accorded the proper nomenclature: labels.

We are sorry to hear and record the death of one of our earliest members, Dr. Jaffrey of Dundas, Ont., Canada. To the widow, Mrs. R. Jaffrey

and family, we express our heartfelt sympathy.

We wish to call our members' attention in this issue to a resumé of Cross Stamp Company's two sales: May 24, 25 and 26, 1951 and July 12, 1951. Most of the Czecho material offered was more or less very scarce, many items were unique. We asked the Cross Co. to send us a list of the prices realized at these two auctions because no collector in the U. S. and many countries other than those within the Soviet influence had even a vague idea of the value of these rarities. We trust this report will meet with the approval of our members. Incidentally, if any member wishes catalogs of future sales of scarce Czecho material, he should write to the Cross Stamp Co., 551 Fifth Ave., New York 17, N. Y. From our own experience we know that more Czech rarities are sold by this company than any other in the United States.

While on the subject, please note next issue of the Specialist which will contain an ad from the United Stamp Co., of New York, advertising another outstanding collection which will appear on the auction block. You may now write for this catalog to 405 E. 54th St., New York 22, N. Y. Be sure to

mention the Specialist.

OUR PRAHA LETTER

It is common knowledge that in all eastern countries the citizens will be required to vote for peace. I am sure that in the countries of the west the same basic thought prevails but without the additional fanfare of an election. Even stamp collectors in our country have put in their 10 hellers by asking the Ministry of Posts to use the slogan "Czechoslovakia votes for Peace" in all major post offices of the land.

Our oldest philatelic organization, the "Czechoslovak Stamp Club," will hold a "liquidating meeting" June 8, 1951 at 19 o'clock in its old quarters in the Hetel Paris. At this meeting members will be urged to ally themselves with the various ROH groups philatelic section, if for no other reason than to keep the flame of honest philately flickering. Sic transit gloria mundi.

A very fine article entitled "What are the Classics?" appeared in the magazine "Filatelie." According to the author the term is usually used for the stamps issued in the first 30 years of the use of postage stamps. (Editor's Note: This is arbitrary. Some very old stamps never attained the title "Classic." On the other hand comparatively new stamps (as the type 2, 1922 U. S., especially some phases of it, especially type II in combination with type I in coil form have been accorded this distinction.) However, exceptions can be made, yes, must be made, in the various countries. In Czechoslovakia, the Hradčany issues are the true classics.

New stamps, commemorating an early hero of socialism, Bohumír Šmeral, will soon be issued. Dr. Šmeral organized the Czech proletariat in Vienna in the early years of this century. After the liberation of Czechoslovakia he was a leading force in the labor movement here. He died in Russia in 1941 (according to some, disappointed at the condition of the laboring class' position in "the peoples' republic."—Ed.) At his bier, K. Gottwald spoke the funeral oration at which time he promised the deceased "We shall tear down the swastika cross rag and replace it with the flag of liberty." Prophetic words, indeed.

The new air mail stamps are evidently the products of more than one plate per design judging from the placement of the position dots.

In the recent Souvenir Block containing four views of Praha appears a very interesting picture. It will be of especial interest to collectors of "Ex Libris" labels; this stamp, the 1.50 Kcs has been engraved as an "Ex Libris" in an almost identical design but quite larger, of course.

The new issues service of POFIS announces that stamps of the Eastern Democratic Republics "except Poland and Roumania, with which negotiations are in progress," will be available to collectors at "a moderate increase above face value." Likewise, the stamps of Czechoslovakia will be available to

these countries under identical conditions.

Perhaps the most significant news from our country to the readers of the Specialist is the announcement of the Post Office Department that mail matter sent from Czechoslovakia must not be overfranked. In the past many collectors have been sending blocks of four on their mail to collectors everywhere. This practice is permissable providing the amount of postage conforms with postage rates. Otherwise such mail will be confiscated.

PARADE OF NEW ISSUES

A New Commem. Series Depicting Recreation Centers for Working People





To publicize the opening of the summer season in the numerous recreation centers owned by the Trade Union, the Czechoslovak Post Administration issued on May 5th, 1951, a set of three stamps with the pictures of mountain landscapes, of following denominations:

Kčs 1.50, green, showing a picture of a recreation center in the Tatra mtns. Kčs 2.—, brown, showing a picture of a recreation center in Beskydy mtns. Kčs 3.—, red, showing a picture of a recreation center in Krkonoše mtns.

The values of Kčs 1.50 and 2.— have been designed by Jiří Blažek and engraved by Bohdan Roule, the value of Kčs 3.— has been designed by Hana Hrubešová, drawn by Jindra Schmidt and engraved by Jaroslav Goldschmied.

A proper name of the recreation center is shown on each stamp, as well as an inscription "HORY PATRI PRACUJICIM" (Mountains belong to the Working People) with the initials ROH (initials designating the Czechoslovak Trade Union).

The stamps in the form of a horizontal rectangle 23.5 x 37 mm. in dimension are recess-printed in sheets of 50 and 25 copies and are valid for postage from May 5th, 1951, until further notice.

At the same time a cacheted First Day Cover and a Collection Sheet, both bearing a special first day postmark, have been also issued.

Commemorative Issue "30 Years of the Czechoslovak Communist Party."



On May 17th, 1951, the Czechoslovak Post Administration issued a series of three stamps to commemorate the 30th Anniversary of the foundation of the Czechoslovak Communist Party. The denominations are as follows:

Kčs 8.-, grey, depicting founders of Socialism Marx, Engels, Lenin, Stalin.

Kčs 3.-, red, depicting a Red-Army soldier and a Partisan.

Kčs 2.-, brown, with a picture of a Factory-Militia man.

On the first stamp the artist Jiří Hronek has designed besides the mentioned portraits the symbol of the emancipation of the Working Class, the Socialist and Soviet banner with the inscription "Proletáři všech zemí, spojte se!" (Workers of all lands unite). The engraving of the stamp is by Jan Mráček.

The other stamps are reproductions of čumpelík's posters "Se Sovětským Svazem na věčné časy" (With the Soviet Union for ever), engraved by Ladislav Jirka, and "Výstava revolučuích bojů" (Exhibition of the Revolutionary Fighting), engraved by Bohdan Roule.

The 30th Anniversary of the Czechoslovak Communist Party is expressed by the inscription "30 let KSC" to be found on each of the stamps.

To complete this commemorative issue, two more stamps will be issued by the Post Administration on May 30th, 1951, with the following denominations:

Kes 1.50 and Kes 5.—

both values showing the portraits of J. V. Stalin and President Klement Gottwald. The stamps have been designed and engraved by Jindra Schmidt.

All the stamps are recess-printed in sheets of 50 and 25 copies. The values showing the portraits are in the form of a horizontal rectangle, and those after the Cumpelik's posters of a vertical rectangle, 23.5 x 37 mm. in dimension.

All the stamps are valid for postage until further notice.

For each of the aforesaid emissions a cacheted First Day Cover (of equal cachet) after the design by Václav Šprungl, engraved by František Navrátil, as well as a Collection Sheet, will be also issued.



(IInd emission)

On May 30th, 1951, the Czechoslovak Post Administration issued the 2nd emission of two stamps to commemorate the 30th Anniversary of the foundation of the Ceczhoslovak Communist Party, with the denominations of:

Kčs 1.50, olive green and Kčs 5.—, blue Both values showing portraits of J. V. Stalin and President Klement Gottwald and bearing an inscription "30 let KSč" (30 years of the Cezchoslovak Communist Party), are recess printed in sheets of 50 and 25, format 23.5 x 37 mm arranged horizontally. They are valid for postage from May 30. Designer and engraver was Jindra Schmidt.

A cacheted First Day Cover (of identical cachet with the 1st emission) after the design by Václav Šprungl, engraved by František Navrátil, as well as a Collection Sheet, were also issued.

Commemorative Issue "Pražské jaro" (The Spring of Prague)



Honoring the International Musical Festival "Pražské jaro" (The Spring of Prague) and its peace mission, the Czechoslovak Post Administration issued on May 30th four commemorative stamps with the portraits of the geniuses of Czechoslovak music Bedřich Smetana (1824-1864) and Antonín Dvořák (1841-1906). The portraits are the work of professor Karel Svolínský showing both composers from the years of their highest creation.

The stamps are of the following denominations and colors:

Kčs 1 .--, red-brown, with the portrait of Antonín Dvořák

Kčs 1.50, grey, with the portrait of Bedřich Smetana

Kčs 2.-, brown, with the portrait of Antonín Dvořák

Kčs 3 .--, violet rose, with the portrait of Bedřich Smetana

The Bedřich Smetana stamp is engraved by Jan Mráček, the engraving of the Antonín Dvořák stamp is by Jindra Schmidt.

The Kčs 1.50 and Kčs 2.— stamps are recess printed on flat plates in sheets of 10 copies. The stamps of Kčs 1.— and Kčs 3.— are recess printed in sheets of 70 and 35 copies. All the stamps are in the form of a vertical rectangle 23.5 x 30 mm. Their validity for postage from 30th May 1951, until further notice.

At the same time a cacheted First Day Cover designed by the author of the stamps and a Collection Sheet were also issued.

Commemorative issue Dr. Bohumír šmeral



Honoring the tenth anniversary of the death of Dr. Bohumír šmeral, a distinguished fighter for the Working Class, the Czechoslovak Post Administration issued on June 21st, a set of two commemorative stamps with the denominations of

Kčs 1.50, green, and Kčs 3.—, red showing the portrait of Dr. Smeral, designed by Václav Sprungl, engraved by Ladislav Jirka.

The stamps are recess printed on white paper in sheets of 50 and 25 copies, in the form of a vertical rectangle 23.5 x 37 mm. They are valid for postage from June 21st, 1951.

At the same time a cacheted First Day Cover after a design by Václav Šprungl, engraved by František Navrátil, as well as a Collection Sheet, were also issued.

Commemorative Issue the IX Congress of the Czechoslovak Sokol Federation



Honoring the IXth Congress of the Czechoslovak Sokol Federation, the Czechoslovak Post Administration issued on June 21st, 1951, a set of four commemoratives with the following motives and denominations:

Kčs 1 .--, green, A gymnast in the rings.

Kčs 1.50, brown, A sport woman throwing discus

Kčs 3 .--, red, Football players.

Kčs 5 .--, blue, A skier.

All the designs and engravings are by J. A. Svengsbír. The stamps are recess printed on yellow paper in sheets of 70 and 35 copies, in the form of a vertical rectangle 26 x 33 mm in dimension. They are valid for postage from June 21st, 1951.

At the same time a cacheted First Day Cover, designed and engraved by the author of the stamps, as well as a Collection Sheet, were also issued.

Commemorative Issue "The Soviet Film"



On the occasion of the International Film Festival held from 14th to 29th July, 1951, at Karlovy Vary, under the motto "for Peace, for a New Man, for a Better World," the Czechoslovak Ministry of Posts issued a set of the following commemoratives:

- (1) Kčs .80 brown rose
- (2) Kčs 1.50 gray green
- (3) Kčs 4.— blue

The stamps (1) and (3) represent a scene from the top work of the world cinematography "Pád Berlína" (The Fall of Berlin) and were designed by Karel Perman, engraved by Jan Mráček. The stamp (2) shows a scene from the glorious pre-war film "Velký občan" (The Great Citizen), designed by Jiří Figer, engraved by Jindra Schmidt. The design is completed by the inscriptions "Se sovětským filmem v boji za mír" (With the Soviet Film in the Fight for World-Peace) and "Se sovětským filmem k výstavbě socialismu" (With the Soviet Film towards Socialism).

The stamps are recess printed in sheets of 50 and 25 copies, having the shape of a horizontal rectangle, 23.5×37 mm in dimension.

Validity for postage from July 14th, 1951, until further notice.

At the same time a cacheted First Day Cover designed by Jiří Figer, engraved by Bohdan Roule and a Collection Sheet both bearing a special first day postmark were also issued.
