## EDITORIAL

The New York group suggested to its members they send a voluntary gift of money to the editor for which sum he, at his discretion, shall purchase something for the donor from the auction. Such an act should be imitated.

Many of the members failed to heed our request to pay dues and this is the last issue of the Specialist they receive. The membership loss this way is very big; your treasurer and editor decided to do something about it. All delinquent members will get a statement shortly and when they pay their dues they will get the Specialist they may have missed. We shall be charitable and publish in the following Specialist a list "Omitted through Error" together with those we really omit through error.

Betwixt and between! As we prepare this issue of your Specialist it is too early to predict the result of our 1952 venture. This much seems sure at this writing; the show will be a flop! Of the 200 members only 6 promised to show their stamps at the exhibition. Of the 200 members only about a dozen donated material to the auction. One dealer member helped by sending about 90% of the material; of that only a small percentage reaches the treasury. If the Chicago group has a deficit the non-participating members should beat their breasts exclaiming "Mea culpa, mea maxima culpa."

We are not the only officer with troubles. Our treasurer called us yesterday asking "Have you written the editorial?" Assuring him we hope to get at it today he asked us to plead with the members if they fail to receive their membership card by "return post" not to get excited. He works on the Society business only on Saturday when he sends his report to the secretary who also does the Society business on Saturday. Let at least four weeks elapse before you holler!

For 10 years we complained that members send dues to us, register complaints with us. Now we realize we have no right to cry. For ten years we have been telling the members that the Specialist is the plaster that holds the Society together. As chief plasterer we can best feel the strength of the structure if members either praise or complain to us. Some time ago we bragged about being a good American by belly-achin'. If we continue holding our tummy hollerin' ouch, pay no attention to us, it may be a sign that all is going well.

Before the year 1952 descended upon us we promised the members a 16 page Specialist every issue, if the treasury can stand it. So far, so good. We hope the members like it. As soon as we drop to an 8 page issue you know the treasury feels the pinch. If you can offer it some good green

blood, endorsed by the U. S. Treasury (or any other government this side of the metallic window shades), we then may strive to continue the good work started with the January issue.

Yesterday we visited with Mr. Frank Vinson of United Stamp Co. (New York) at the Morrison Hotel. We had an opportunity to view the immense collection of Mr. Willy Krauss which is being auctioned off March 26-28. As this collection contains much uncatalogued material, Mr. Vinson promised to send us a listing of prices realized. Only in this way can we learn the approximate value of Specialized items.

To the amazement of all, Mr. Stern showed about 350 different kinds of sets. Some are on Protectorate stamps while those emanating from the Sudetenland appear on German stamps. The New York Group thanks Mr. Stern for his kindness in bringing this collection for the group's inspection. The more common material is plentiful. I have seen many of our new issues in complete sets and these sell slightly over face." This is interesting in view of the fact that Pofis sells the stamps very much over face, out of all proportion.

Among the most recent first day covers received from Czechoslovakia is a cover with two stamps portraying Jan Kollár, the Slovak poet who died just one hundred years ago. Another cover shows two stamps featuring Lenin in a medallion in the upper right hand corner and his room in Praha where 40 years ago an all-Russian conference of the Social Democratic Party took place under the guidance and leadership of Lenin.

## PARADE OF NEW ISSUES

New commemoratives to honor the "40th Anniversary of the VIth All-Russian Party Conference in Prague"



In the days January 18th.-30th, 1912, the Sixth All-Russian Party Conference, organized and presided by V. I. Lenin, was held at the Lidový dům (the Popular House). At this Conference the Party was rid of opportunists, of Mensheviks and laid the basis to a party of a new type, the party of Leninism, the Bolshevik Party was laid. To mark the 40th Anniversary of this Party Conference, the Czechoslovak Ministry of Posts issued two commemorative stamps of the following denominations and colors:

Kčs 1.50, brown-red,                            Kčs 5.—, blue

Both the stamps show the same design—the Lenin Hall, after the design by Jarmila Vávrová, completed by a portrait of V. I. Lenin, after the plastic by professor Jan Lauda.

The stamps in form of horizontal rectangle, 23.5 x 31 mm in dimension, are recess-printed in sheets of 100 copies. Validity for postage from January 30th, 1952.

A cacheted First Day Cover, designed by Karel Svolinský, engraved by Jaroslav Goldschmied, as well as a Collection Sheet, were issued at the same time.

## New series commemorating Ján Kollár



To commemorate the 100th anniversary of the death of Ján Kollár (7.II.-1793-28.I.1851), the poet and one of the leaders of the Czech and Slovak nation at the time of National Awakening, the Czechoslovak Ministry of Posts issued two commemorative stamps with his portrait. The author of the design of these stamps is professor Karel Svolinský, the engraving is by Jindra Schmidt.

The stamps were issued on January 30th, 1952, in the following denominations and colors:

Kčs 3.— red                                    Kčs 5.— blue.

The stamps in form of vertical rectangle, 23 x 30 mm in dimension, are recess-printed in sheets of 50 copies.

Validity for postage from January 30th, 1952.

A cacheted First Day Cover designed by the author of the stamps and engraved by Jindra Schmidt, as well as a Collection Sheet, were issued at the same time.

New Issue honoring Dr. Emil Holub



To commemorate the 50th anniversary of the death of Dr. Emil Holub, the famous Czech explorer in Africa, falling on February 21st, 1952, the Czechoslovak Ministry of Posts issued two commemoratives of the following denominations:

Kčs 3.— red                            Kčs 5.— blue

Both the stamps show the explorer Dr. Holub talking to an African native, after the design of professor Karel Svolinský. The engraving is by Jan Mráček.

The stamps are recess-printed in sheets of 50 copies in form of horizontal rectangle, 23 x 30 mm in dimension.

Validity for postage from February 21st, 1952.

A cacheted First Day Cover designed by professor Karel Svolinský, engraved by Jaroslav Goldschmied, as well as a Collection Sheet, were issued at the same time.

New Commemoratives "The Building of Socialism—Industry"



To commemorate the anniversary of the February 25, 1948, the Czechoslovak Ministry of Posts issued three commemoratives propagating the Building of Socialism in Industry, with the following motives, denominations and colors:

- (1) New metallurgical plants "Klement Gottwald" at Kunčice, after the design by professor Vladimír Silovský, Kčs 1.50, gray.
- (2) A foundry, designed by J. C. Vondrouš, Kčs 2.—, brown.
- (3) New chemical plants, Kčs 3.—, red.

All the stamps are printed in photogravure in sheets of 100 copies, in form of vertical rectangle, 23 x 30.5 mm in dimension. Validity for postage from February 25th, 1952.

A cacheted First Day Cover designed and engraved by J. A. Švengsbíř, as well as a Collection Sheet, were issued at the same time.




