PARADE OF NEW ISSUES

New Commemoratives Thirtieth Anniversary of Death of V. I. Lenin

To commemorate the 30th anniversary of death of V. I. Lenin, the Ministry of Communications issued on 21st January, 1954, two commemorative postage stamps

30 h, gray

Kčs 1.40, light brown

The 30 h stamp shows the portrait of V. I. Lenin, designed by professor Karel Svolinský after the plastic work by professor Jan Lauda. The pen-ink drawing and engraving is by Jindra Schmidt.

The Kčs 1.40 stamp shows the V. I. Lenin Museum in Prague, designed



and engraved by Jiří Švengsbír.

Both stamps were recess-printed in Post Printing Office in Prague. The 30 h stamp is in vertical form, dimension of the picture 23x30mm, sheets of 50 copies. The Kčs 1.40 stamp is in horizontal form 48.5x29.5mm, sheets of 25 copies.

The official First Day Cover for this issue was designed by professor Karel Svolinský, engraved by Jindra Schmidt.

POŠTOVNA CANCELS

(Note: U. S. has no postal establishment or name comparable to the word or function of POŠTOVNA. The nearest to it would be a MAIL COLLECTION OFFICE. It simply collects letters, sometimes packages, cancels and dispatches them, it gives no other service. So, the word POŠTOVNA will be used throughout this article.)

In small settlements, where it would not be economical to have a post-office, collection places, called POŠTOVNA are established. These are usually on the premises of some business or tavern. A plaque with the word POŠTOVNA is attached to the outside of the building.

The POŠTOVNA has a collection box on the outside and accepts and dispatches all ordinary mail. It has a cancelling stamp, usually a framed rectangle with the name of the LOCALE and the name of the supervising post-office. The official color of the cancel is violet, but black, blue, green and red ones are encountered.

Paragraph 9 of the Postal Regulations re. cancellations states:

- a) POŠTOVNA will cancel with their cancelling device fully franked ordinary mail and only that which is addressed within their district or which is to be delivered by the rural mail carrier.
- b) In exceptional cases the POŠTOVNA may be authorized to cancel mail directed outside of their district, in which case a metal cancelling device with a date insert will be supplied.

These two excerpts from the regulations explain the origin of POŠTOVNA cancels on stamps and prove they are not accidental.

The correspondence within the POŠTOVNA district being rather light, these cancels are rare. Less scarce are those on mail which was sent to the supervising postoffice for forwarding. Registered mail had to be sent to the Postoffice for re-registration.

The oldest known example of POŠTOVNA cancels are of the year 1904 (Illus. C. K. Listovní sběrna MACOCHA). We do not find this cancel on the mail of 1918, but cancels of Type I (Illus. 1) which were used until that year and are considered the oldest.

The Austrian Authorities furnished POŠTOVNA with rubber cancelling stamps of various sizes mono or bilingual. (Illus. 2). The Hungarian postal regulations differed from the Austrian in that the POŠTOVNA was furnished a metal cancelling stamp with a date insert and was authorized to accept and cancel all ordinary letter and parcel mail. That explains the provisional cancels on packages from Slovakia.

Nationalization of cancels after Oct. 18, 1918 was accomplished by excising the German or Hungarian names from the cancels. This was easy with the soft material (rubber); either the German word was cut out or part of the cancel (6A Šyrovýn or 11A Tursko, Libšice n. Vlt.) was cut off. In some cases the bottom part of the frame was pasted back after cutting out the name. (7A Lobeč, Mšeno u Mělníka).

The Hungarian cancels were nationalized by reversing the date insert. The Hungarian order of year, month and day was set in reverse, that is day, month and year and the letters d. e. or d. u. were replaced by slugs. (d. e. means délelöt-A.M., d. u. means délután-P.M.) The cancel Murányhosszurét was changed to Murán by cutting off part of the name. Illus. 12A, 12B.
