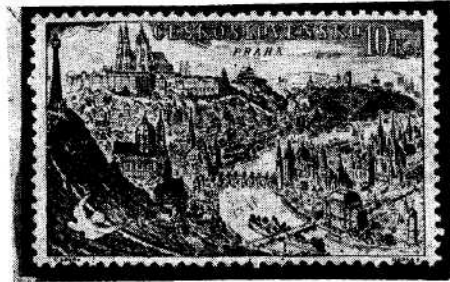

New 10 Kčs Air Mail Stamp showing a picture of Prague

The Ministry of Communications issued on February 20th, 1955, a new 10 Kčs Air Mail Stamp. The design for this stamp was made after a copy of the engraving of Prague 63.5 by 29.5 cm, by Cyril Bouda. The design of the stamp and the engraving are executed by Jindra Schmidt.

The stamp was recess-printed on yellowish paper in dark blue color in sheets of 25 copies, 49 by 30 mm in dimension, by the Post Printing Office in Praha.

Validity for postage from February 20th, 1955.

New Air Mail Stamps (2nd Part of the Issue)

The Ministry of Communications issued the second part of the Airmails Issue of the following values and designs:

1. The 80 hal. stamp shows the town Český Krumlov. The design and the engraving is by Jiří Švengsbír. The design was made after the drawing of a plan of this town by Bohuslav Coufal, painter artist. The color is green.
2. The 1.55 Kčs value showing the town Olomouc after the drawing by professor Cyril Bouda, designed by Jindra Schmidt, engraved by Jaroslav Goldschmied. The color is brown.
3. The 2.35 Kčs value depicts the town Banská Bystrica. The design and the



engraving are by Jaroslav Švengsbír. The color is blue.

4. The 2.75 Kčs stamp shows Bratislava after the drawing by Karel Vik, graphic artist, designed and engraved by Bedřich Housa. The color is red brown.

All the stamps were recess-printed by the Post Printing Office in Prague on yellowish paper in sheets of 25 copies. Dimensions of the stamps are 49 by 30 mm.

Validity for postage from 28th March 1955.



New Commemoratives "Propaganda of the Czechoslovak Products"

The Ministry of Communications issued on 15th March 1955 a set of three commemorative postage stamps propagating the Czechoslovak products.

The designs, denominations and colors are the following:

1. A motor-car type "Škoda", 45 hal. value, green.
2. A shuttleless jet loom, 60 hal. value, blue.
3. A machine-tool type "Škoda", 75 hal. value, grey.

The designs of these three stamps are by Jiří Běhounek, graphic artist. The engravings of the 45 hal. and 75 hal. values are by Ladislav Jirka, the engraving of the 60 hal. value is by Bohdan Roule.

All three stamps are recess-printed by the Post Printing Office in Prague in sheets of 50 copies. Dimensions of the stamp picture are 30 x 23 mm.

Validity for the postage from 15th March, 1955.

The official First Day Cover was designed and engraved by Jiří Švengsbír.

POŠTOVNA CANCELS

Zdeňek Kvasnička

The main post office in Praha used a machine cancel, which beside the regular cancel and five wavy lines also printed a circle with Franco Hotově. In the center of this circle is a rectangle with numerals 5, 10 and 20 hal. (Fig. 25). Prints of this cancel found on mail with higher franks have the proper figure inserted by hand (fig. 26). This cash payment frank must not be confused with the free frank of official correspondence, which was usually stamped Věc Úřední Porta Prostá. (Figs. 27, 28.)

2—Emergency Stickers and Stamps for Periodicals

The shortage of newspaper stamps was circumvented by an order of the Ministry of Posts and Telegraphs (No. 121 G 18) which permitted cash payment of postage for periodicals. According to the order, all newspaper mail had to be plainly marked Franco-Hotově Zaplaceno. Large publishing firms, like Národní Politika, České Slovo, Našinec and others, to simplify the handling printed their stickers with proper text and stuck them on the wrappers. (Fig. 29, 30). Others used commercial stickers on which the text was printed or stamped (figs. 32 to 35). The cancelling of franks on newspapers is opposite to the letter mail, that is, the cancelling is done by the receiving post offices instead of dispatching post offices. This accounts for a variety of cancels on the same kind of stickers. Mint and cancelled stickers on the original wrappers are in great demand by collectors, being proof of the confusion during the period. Mint wrappers of large newspapers are very common and of not much value. Wrappers of the small newspapers are found only cancelled. The use of stickers on newspapers is not new. The Národní Politika, under the Austrian regime, used stickers on their newspapers sent to soldiers in hospitals. The text on these stickers is Národní Politika-Gratis, with a red cross in the center. Very few of these were saved, but it is possible some do exist with Fieldpost cancels.

The following stickers are known and authentic:

- 1 Národní Politika-Gratis, red on white paper (fig. 36).
- 2 Národní Politika, Praha, brick red on thin yellowish paper (fig. 37).
- 3 České Slovo, Praha, brick red on green or white (fig. 38).
- 4 Práce, Praha, black on white (fig. 39).
- 5 Našinec, Olomouc, white letters on red background, white paper (fig. 40).
- 6 Rovnost', Brno, black on rose red.
- 7 Merkur, Praha, black on white.
- 8 Národné Noviny, Turč. Sv. Martin, black on grayish granite paper.
- 9 Český Merkur, Praha, white sticker with a blue frame. Text is done by a hand stamp in violet Porto Hotově Zaplaceno, or in a three line book-print in black, Poštovné Hotově Zaplaceno (figs. 31, 41).
- 10 Lloyd, Praha, three line black print Poštovné Hotově Zaplaceno on green paper (fig. 42).
- 11 Komenský, Zábřeh, three line black print Poštovné Zaplaceno on white perforated sticker.
- 12 Čech, Praha, Poštovné Placené in two lines on red paper.
- 13 Pilsner Tagblatt, Plzeň, black on rose (fig. 43).
- 14 Mährisch Schl. Presse, Frývaldov, black Franco Bar on white.
- 15 Ankündigungsblatt der Forstwirtschaft des Handels u. der Holzindustrie Prachatice, black on violet paper in two sizes of type.

This list, of course is not complete, as other authenticated stickers may show up any time.
