EDITORIAL

Your editor was gratified by the large number of Christmas greetings sent to him by members of the Society. We mentioned on previous occasions it is not possible to answer all individually; besides we get many greetings from former members of the military outfit to which we belonged as also from many Boy Scouts in our area. We have been an officer of our veterans' group since the close of WWI and an active scouter almost continuously since 1920. I thank all of you for remembering me.

The officers of your Society who reside in the Chicago area meet every second Sunday of the month just before the meeting of the Chicago Chapter. One half of their two year term has ended and they are preparing to make the last half as fruitful as the one just closed. They asked the editor to stress Compex this year. Our Society is perhaps the only Society which did not raise dues in recent years. The main reason is that the profit from Compex paid the deficit caused by increased cost of postage and the publication of the Handbook. Last year during Compex we had only 11 members exhibiting; of these 7 were from Chicago and 4 from the rest of the world. Among those were Dr. Reiner-Deutsch who never fails to show; James W. Adler, another steady who not only exhibits but makes it his business to attend the Show; Major W. D. Knox who won the Grand Award and promised to show again this year, and Paul Hale, a new member whose exhibit tied in with the theme of the Show, the People-to-People program. We have about 275 members; percentage-wise only a thimbleful exhibit while the rest are free-loaders. We retract that statement; some members who feel they should help send a monetary contribution. But there are some, despite our epistles to the membership, who persist in calling Compex the "Chicago Boys' Show," where the "Chicago boys have a lot of fun." I am sure we could raise among the Chicago boys a sum of money to pay the travel expenses of out-of-town members, providing they contribute their time to the services not only of their Society but of Compex as well. The show does not run by itself; each member Society must supply workers at various stations. Besides that there must be a police force. Despite the fact that police protection is provided by Compex round the clock it is best a member of every group is near his organization's exhibit the full 12 hours not only to watch but to advise and answer questions put to them by the visitors. A prospectus is enclosed with this issue of the Specialist and we urge every member to show his stamps regardless of their value. Often a very inexpensive collection can get an award, as in the case of Major Knox's Hradcany collection last year which gained the Grand Award. We have one more gimmick to raise money by subscribing with one dollar to "Goodfellows." Your name is mentioned in a small ad, size of ad depends on the number of Goodfellows and this brings some extra revenue to the participating Society. Last year we had 11 Goodfellows (all Chicagoans) who paid 11 dollars for an ad which cost the Society about \$3, the balance went to the treasury. This too can be sent to George Havlik.

In response to an appeal for articles, especially for the Compex Directory we have an article promised by Dr. Reiner-Deutsch. We have many more members who could sit down and write on some facet of Czechoslovak philately. We do not expect a literary masterpiece; your editor finished his schooling career after only ½ year in High School. When we want a polished article we send it to our accomodating member Dick Spofford who does an excellent job. Get busy, write that article and send it to the editor immediately.

The International Stamp Exhibition to be held in Praha in 1962 has chosen Dr. Matejka to be its United States representative. Dr. Matejka asks all our members to make preparations for this event both by exhibiting and where possible, by personally attending.

There is only one thing that irritates us; the Exhibition Committee asks that no Masarykana be shown and nothing of the Siberian section of Czechoslovak postal history. We in the free world do not fall for the red propaganda that the glorious Soviet Army liberated Czechoslovakia in 1945; it is no secret that the liberation of Poland was done in conjunction with a diabolic plan to exterminate the Polish intelligentsia by prolonging the siege of Warsaw. We shall do all in our power to make the 1962 Show a success without vacillating to a government composed of red-starred, hammer and sickled dictators.

Your 1961 dues are due, in fact overdue. In the envelope with this issue of the Specialist you'll find a dues envelope; please remit as soon as possible to the treasurer. Parade Of New Issues

New Commemoratives "Cultural Personalities"



To commemorate the anniversaries of outstanding personalities in Czech culture, the Czechoslovak Ministry of Transport and Communications issued on August 23rd, 1960, a series of commemorative stamps of the following denominations, designs and colors:

- a) 10 h, Viktorin Kornel ze Všehrd, outstanding lawyer (500th anniversary of his birth); black,
- b) 20 h, Karel Matěj Čapek Chod, writer (100th anniversary of his birth); brown,
- c) 30 h, Hana Kvapilová, outstanding Czech actress (100th anniversary of her birth); pale red,
- d) 40 h, Oskar Nedbal, composer; dark green,
- e) 60 h, Otakar Ostrčil, composer; blue-violet.

The stamps c) and e) were designed by Professor Dr. h. c. Max Švabinský, the designs of the remaining stamps are the work of Vladimír Silovský, rector at the Academy of Creative Arts in Prague.

The designs of the two First Day Covers were also executed by the above-mentioned authors. All stamps as well as the First Day Cover by Professor Dr. h. c. Max Švabinský were engraved by Jindra Schmidt. The engraving of the second First Day Cover is the work of Jaroslav Goldschmied.

The stamps were printed by the Post Printing Office in Prague by the rotary recess print in sheets of 50. Dimensions of the stamp picture are 23x41 mm.

Validity in internal and international postal use is from August 23rd, 1960 until further notice.

The First Day Cover executed by Professor Dr. h. c. Max Švabinsky bears stamps of 30 h and 60 h, the second First Day Cover bears stamps of 10 h and 40 h.

Commemoratives to the 1st World Championship in Air Acrobatics



The Ministry of Transport and Communications issued on August 28th, 1960, one commemorative postage stamp to mark the occasion of the 1st World Championship in Air Acrobatics in Bratislava.

The stamp (60 h) depicts an aeroplane during an upside-down flight.

The stamp was designed by the academic artist Karel Vysušil and engraved by Jan Mráček.

The design of the First Day Cover was also executed by Karel Vysušil and engraved by Jaroslav Goldschmied.

The stamp was printed by the Post Printing Office in Prague, by the bi-colored recess print in sheets of 50. Dimensions of the stamp picture are 41x23 mm.


Validity in internal and international postal use is from August 28th, 1960, until further notice.

Stamps Commemorating the Proclamation of the New Czechoslovak Socialist Constitution, 40th Anniversary of Foundation of the Daily Rudé právo and 15th Anniversary of World Trade-Union Federation



The Ministry of Transport and Communications issued on September 18, 1960, four commemoratives of the following denominations, designs and colors:

- 1) 30 h, commemorating the proclamation of Czechoslovakia's New Socialist Constitution. Designed by prof. Karel Svolinský, engraved by Jindra Schmidt. Colors: blue and red. Design of the First Day Cover by prof. Karel Svolinský, engraving by Jaroslav Goldschmied.
- 2) 30 h, Day of Czechoslovak Press
60 h, 40th anniversary of the daily "Rudé Právo." Both stamps were designed by Milan Kopřiva, engraved by Jaroslav Goldschmied (60 h according to the drawing by Ladislav Jirka) and Ladislav Jirka (30 h). Colors: 30 h, dark brown and red; 60 h, dark blue and red. The First Day Cover was engraved by Jaroslav Goldschmied according to the graphic symbol of the daily.

All stamps were printed by the rotary recess print combined with photo-gravure in the Post Printing Office in Prague in sheets of 50. The dimensions of the stamp picture are 41x23 mm.

The stamps are valid in internal and international postal use from September 18th, 1960, until further notice.

New Airmails to Mark the Occasion of the National Philatelic Exhibition at Bratislava in 1960

(2nd part)



To mark the National Philatelic Exhibition—which takes place at Bratislava from Sept. 24th to Oct. 9th, 1960—the Ministry of Transport and Communications issued two large-size airmail stamps. They are of the following denominations, designs and colors:

- a) 1.60 Kčs horse-drawn mail coach, a jet plane and the city arms of Bratislava. Colors: black, blue and light blue.
 b) 2.80 Kčs general view of Bratislava with the Slavin Monument in fore-

ground and the Bratislava Castle in background, a helicopter.
Colors: green and yellow.

Both stamps bear the inscription "National Philatelic Exhibition at Bratislava, 1960".

The stamps were designed by the academic artist Josef Baláž and engraved by Bohdan Roule and Jaroslav Goldschmied. They were printed in the Post Printing Office in Prague by the rotary recess print combined with photogravure in sheets of 25. The dimensions of the stamp picture are 49x30mm.

The stamps are valid in internal and international postal use from Sept. 24th, 1960, until further notice.

One First Day Cover was issued, designed by Josef Baláž and engraved by Jaroslav Goldschmied.

Stamps Depicting Fresh-water Birds



The Ministry of Transport and Communications issued on October 24, 1960, a series of six postage stamps depicting the following fresh-water birds:

- 25 h, *nycticorax nycticorax* L., black and blue
- 30 h, *podiceps cristatus* L., black and green
- 40 h, *vanellus vanellus* L., green and blue
- 60 h, *ardea cinerea* L., black and pink
- 1 Kcs *anser anser* L., black and yellow
- 1.60 Kcs *anas platyrhyncha* L., black and violet

The stamps as well as the two First Day Covers were designed by the academic artist Ota Janeček. They were engraved by Jiří Švengsbír (40 h, 60 h and 1 Kcs) and Bedřich Housa (25 h, 30 h and 1.60 Kcs). The First Day Cover engraved by Jiří Švengsbír bears the values of 40 h, 60 h and 1 Kcs, whereas the one engraved by Bedřich Housa displays the denominations of 20 h, 30 h and 1.60 Kcs.

All stamps were printed by the rotary recess print combined with photogravure in the Post Printing Office in Prague in sheets of 50. The dimensions of the stamp picture are 23x41 mm and 41x23 mm.

The stamps are valid in internal and international postal use from October 24, 1960, until further notice.

Stamps Depicting Flowers



The Ministry of Transport and Communications issued on November 21, 1960, a series of six stamps depicting flowers. The stamps will be of the following denominations and colors:

- 20 h, *Doronicum Clusii* Tausch, yellow, orange, green and black
- 30 h, *Cyclamen europaeum* L., pink, red, green and black
- 40 h, *Primula auricula* L., yellow, lt.-green, dark-green and black
- 60 h, *Sempervivum mont.* L., green, red, brown and grey
- 1 Kcs *Gentiana Clusii*. Perr et Song, violet, blue, green and black
- 2 Kcs *Pulsatilla slavica* Reuss, yellow, green, violet and grey

All stamps were designed by prof. Karel Svolinský, engraved by Ladislav Jirka.

The stamps were printed in the Post Printing Office in Prague in four colors by the flat recess print in sheets of ten. The dimensions of the stamp picture are 23x30 mm.

The stamps are valid in internal and international postal use from November 21, 1960, until further notice.

Two First Day Covers were issued with this emission, designed by prof. Karel Svolinský and engraved by Ladislav Jirka.

E. PROVISIONAL POSTAGE DUE STAMPS

After the liberation of Czechoslovakia, October 28, 1918, there developed an acute shortage of postage due stamps. In the early days the postage due stamps of the Austro-Hungarian Empire were used but after the end of February, 1919, these were no longer valid for use. During two separate periods first when the supply of the Austro-Hungarian postage due stamps was used up and also when there were adjustments in the postal rates requiring a rather large quantity of postage due stamps to be used, the Minister of Posts permitted local postmasters to utilize other stamps at their disposal when they ran out of regular postage due stamps. It was not until June 8, 1920, after the period of shortage had ended that an order of the Minister of Posts prohibited the local postmasters to use their discretion. Thereafter such practice was prohibited.
