
Throughout the Show the Society maintained a table at which publications and souvenir covers were sold, and information about the Society and the field of Czechoslovak philately was given out.

On Saturday morning the Board of Directors met, at which time Vice President Jerry Verner reported that the incorporated status of the Society is once again current, and that the steps have been carried out to have the Society recognized as a tax-exempt organization by the Internal Revenue Service. Among other things this means that any contributions made to the Society are now deductible from personal income taxes.

On Saturday afternoon there was a panel of philatelic speakers sponsored jointly by the Austrian Philatelic Society, The Society for Hungarian Philately, and our Society. Denwood Kelly spoke on the Danube Steam Navigation Company's stamps and postmarks, Dominick Riccio talked on the philatelic history of the Carpatho-Ukraine, and Richard Major showed slides from his collection of the Danube River Flotilla in World War I.

Saturday evening there was a well-attended Hospitality Hour in the Society Suite, followed by a Banquet with the Austrian and Hungarian Societies, which featured a Central European menu.

Attendance by Society members was quite good with members present from Costa Rica, Germany, the Netherlands and New Zealand in addition to a number of members from various parts of the United States. Everyone agreed that BALPEX '83 was a great success.

IN MEMORIUM — FRANK J. KAPS



A long-time member of the Society for Czechoslovak Philately, Frank J. Kaps (#88), was killed instantly in an automobile accident near Leesburg, Florida, on July 10, 1983. His wife, Henrietta, died on the way to the hospital. They had been married 52 years.

Frank was born in Bohemia in 1904. He came to New York in the 1930's, where he operated his own importing business, primarily for products of Czechoslovakia. After World War II caused an end to that activity, he worked for the Singer Sewing Machine Company. After retirement, he was a part-time stamp dealer and was the manager of the Sales Department of the Society for Philatelic American from 1964 to 1966.

In recent years the Kaps had lived in Winter Park, Florida, where he continued to be an active collector until his death. He was a member of the American Philatelic Society and the Central Florida Stamp Club in addition to his membership in S.P.A. and our Society. The Kaps had no children, and Frank had no immediate family in the United States.

CZECHOSLOVAKIA'S 1982 POSTAGE STAMP OF THE YEAR


Every year the Czechoslovak Minister of Posts and Communications announces on December 18, Czechoslovak Postage Stamp Day, the awards for the year's best national postage stamps. In 1982, first prize went to the 1 Kč postage stamp issued to mark the 40th anniversary of the razing to the ground of Lidice, the Czech village near Kladno. It was printed by multi-color rotary recess print in black, blue, red, and gold, size 23 × 30 mm. The designer of the stamp is Ivan Schurmann and the master engraver Miloš Ondráček.

Second prize was awarded to two postage stamps, one issued on the occasion of the Second United Nations Conference on the Peaceful Use of Space, UNISPACE, designed by the noted painter Josef Liesler and engraved by J. Herčáik. The other second prize award went to the stamp issued to mark the Second Extraordinary UN General Assembly Disarmament session in New York, designed by National Artist Karel Svolinský and engraved by B. Housa.

Third prize was awarded to the postage stamp depicting the National Memorial on Žižkov Hill in Prague. It was designed by R. Vaněk and engraved by L. Jirka.

BALPEX SOUVENIRS

The printed program for BALPEX '83 was a forty-page, 9-by-12-inch booklet. In addition to a full listing of all of the exhibitors and the dealers of the bourse it contains a fine article by Henry Hahn and Jerry Verner on the Philatelic Elements of the Transition Period of Czechoslovakia, as well as articles on the 1900 Turul Issue of Hungary by Otto Schaffling and the "Hagerstown Bank Find" by Homer Kendall. The Society has obtained a quantity of these programs for those who could not attend BALPEX. They may be ordered for \$1.50 postpaid from Richard Major, P.O. Box 4074, Arlington, VA 22204.



BOHEMOSLOVENICA (continued)

Catalog of stamps and postal stationery containing reference to Czechoslovakia, its land, peoples, their fields of endeavor and achievements

For ease in identification the Michel Catalog is utilized, presumably most widely used in philately.

In some instances catalog numbers for the latest issues were not available at the time of compilation of this work. It is hoped, however, that the description of a particular issue will be sufficiently clear for finding the proper Michel number when available.

RAS AL KHAIMA

For the world championship games in soccer in Mexico, 1970, a set of stamps was issued with the flags of participating nations, among them the flag of Czechoslovakia. The flags, however, are so arranged that it is difficult to distinguish each nation's. Mi 354–360

In 1969 and 1972 a set of stamps was issued with the likeness of W. A. Mozart. Mi 276-280, 642-648.

In 1971 a set was issued to honor composers, among them Joseph Haydn. Details under Austria. Mi 586-591.

In the sports set for the Grenoble Olympics in 1968 appears the Czechoslovak winner Jíří Raška and the Czechoslovak hockey players. Mi 209-213.

In the 1972 flowers set a picture of camellia appears. Details under Japan. Mi 859-864.

RUANDA-URUNDI

A design with the portrait of W. A. Mozart appears in a set issued for 1956. Details under Austria. Mi 156.

For the 200th anniversary of Napoleon's birth a commemorative set was issued in 1969. On the 20-F value is depicted the meeting of the two emperors after the battle of Slavkov in the Spálený mlýn near Nasedlovice. Napoleon I and Francis I here agreed on an armistice. Mi 351–358.

RUMANIA

To note the founding of the so-called Little Entente, Rumania in 1936 issued a set of two overprints with King Carol's portrait with the legend "Cehoslovacia" on the 7.50 and 10-L values. Mi 522–523.

In the following year (1937) special "Little Entente" stamps were issued in the same values as the year before. The stamps have a view of the Cloister church at Curtei de Arges containing the tomb of the royal family of Rumania. The three rings represent the three countries of the entente. Mi 536–537.

For the 100th anniversary of the revolution in 1848 a set of stamps was issued with portraits of outstanding personalities in the event. The 10-L value has the portrait of A. Petöfi. Details under Hungary. Mi 1132–1136.

In 1956 a cultural set was issued containing the portrait of W. A. Mozart who created numerous works during his stay in Praha. Details under Austria. Mi 1604–1613.

Rumania commemorated the 10th annual competition for peace in 1957 by the issue of two stamps, values 20-b and 55-b. In the lower part of each stamp is the legend "X. Annual Competition for Peace." Mi 1643–1644.

The 6th world-wide games of youth and students in Moscow 1957 are commemorated with a set of four stamps. On the 55-b issue are the flags of participating nations, among them Czechoslovakia's. On special tabs with the 1-L value is the legend "Peace and friendship" in several languages, among them in Czech. A commemorative souvenir card was also issued bearing the flag of Czechoslovakia. Mi 1658–1661.

The Czechoslovak flag also appears on the 35-b value in 1957 to note the 40th anniversary of the October Revolution in USSR. Mi 1674–1676.

In 1958 as part of UNESCO action the country issued a set of stamps portraying outstanding personalities, among them Jan Amos Komenský. Mi 1709–1715.

For the international festival of pupper theatres in Bucuresti, 1960, a set of stamps was issued with scenes from pupper plays. On one of sets the stage is enveloped in a ribbon of flags, among them Czechoslovakia's, on the 1.20-L value. Mi 1907–1912.

In a set of stamps of 1929 a portrait of the Prince of Transylvania, Jan Corvin, son of Hungarian King Matthew Corvin, appears. Jan Corvin became the Prince of Liptov and Orava and made Likava near Bužomberok his seat. Mi 346–351.

For the international festival of students in Helsinki, 1962, a 55-b value was issued bearing the flags of participating states, among them Czechoslovakia's. Mi 2068.

The Czechoslovak master engraver Jindra Schmidt taught the art to two Rumanian engravers, J. Avramescu and Mihailescu. J. Avramescu also attended lectures at the Praha Academy of Creative Arts. Both artists made their influence felt in the creation of new designs for stamps of the country.

For the set of supporting flying for sport in 1953 the 55-b value pictures sailplane "Zlín 25 Šohaj 2" and the 1.75-L "Zlín 22 Junák." Both are of Czechoslovak manufacture. Mi 1450–1453.

For the world championship in soccer, games held in Mexico 1970, a special miniature sheet was issued and along the border are listed the participating countries, among them Czechoslovakia. Mi 2846-2849.

For the 100th anniversary of Lenin's birth a special cover was authorized with a view of the Charles Bridge in Praha and his photograph.

For the 300th anniversary of Jan Amos Komenský's birth a cover with Komenský's likeness and an illustration of his book "Didactica opera omnia" was authorized.

In a set of stamps issued for 1971 appears the likeness of astronomer Johann Kepler who at one time lived in Praha. Mi 3001-3004.

In 1973 postal stationery with a value of 30-b was authorized. The stationery pictures

a Skoda product of 1883, a very successful blower.

For the 375th anniversary of unification of Rumanian principalities by Michael the Brave a set of stamps was issued in 1975. On the 55-b value is a likeness of Michael the Brave by Jilji Sadeler (1570-1629) a painter and engraver of Waloon origin who lived at the court of Rudolph II in Praha. Mi 3277-3279.

For the games of university students in 1975 a cover was issued on which the name of Czechoslovakia appears in two parts of the games. Part "A" in Cluj-Napoca, and the semi-finals at Pitesti.

In October 197+ at the "Euromax" exhibition in Bucuresti a special cancelation seal was used on "Day of Czechoslovakia" with the name of country appearing thereon.

For the cooperative exhibition Rumania-Czechoslovakia in 1975 a special cancelation seal was used with the name of Czechoslovakia. A FDC was also authorized with the flag of Czechoslovakia and the logo of the Czechoslovak cooperative society. In 1969 a set of paintings on stamps was issued containing the "Three Graces" by Hans M. Aachen, a painter in the court of Rudolf II. Aachen lived in Praha and died there in 1615. Mi 2755-2760.

A special stamp showing the navigable Danube was issued in 1978. The name of Bratislava appears thereon. Mi 3491.

SAINT LUCIA

A portrait of George V by Bohumil Heinz was used for a set of stamps issued in 1936. Sc 95-106.

EL SALVADOR

For the world championship in soccer held in Mexico 1970 a set of 16 stamps was issued with portraits of teams participating in the competition. The team of Czechoslovakia appears on one of the stamps. Mi 1009.

SAN MARINO

The set of prehistoric animals was inspired by the Czechoslovak artist Prof. Burian. Year of issue 1965. Mi 833-841.

SENEGAL

In the set for the 200th anniversary of founding of the United States of America the portrait of Marquise LaFayette appears on the 500-franc value. Mi 577-578.

SHARJAH

In 1969 in the set of outstanding athletes, winners of Olympic medals, are the likenesses of Czechoslovakia's Věra Čáslavská and Emil Emil Zátopek. Souvenir sheets were also issued. Mi 510–517, 527–541.

In 1970 two sets of stamps were issued with the portraits of W. A. Mozart and Beethoven. Both lived in Praha. Mi 709-736.

For the world championship in soccer in Münich two souvenir sheets were issued and on these appear the name of Czechoslovakia as the winner of the 1934 and 1962 competitions. Mi 1142–1153.

SPAIN

In the set of stamps for 1969 appears the likeness of St. John Capistrano, who in his days was active in the area now known as Czechoslovakia. Mi 1796–1805.

SUDAN

The set of stamps commemorating the death of Gordon Pasha was engraved by Czechoslovak engraver Bohumil Heinz in 1935. The name of the engraver on the 20 and 50 piaster appears on the trunk of the palm. Sc 51–59.

SWEDEN

In 1938 a two-stamp set was issued to commemorate the 100th anniversary of death of P. H. Ling, founder of modern physical culture and Swedish gymnastics. The set was engraved by Boh. Heinz of Czechoslovakia. Mi 253–4.

In 1958 for the world championship games in soccer in Stockholm an envelope was authorized with the flags of the participating nations. Czechoslovakia was among them.

For the 75th anniversary of Universal Postal Union in 1949 a FDC was authorized which bore the flag of Czechoslovakia.

In 1960 for the exposition of Czechoslovak stamps a special cancelation seal was used with the silhouette of Hradčany and appropriate legend.

in 1963 for the world championship hockey games a set of stamps was issued noting several meets, among them a meeting with Czechoslovakia's team.

In 1965 for the 100th anniversary of the International Telegraph Conference a special cover was issued with the legend "... rei de Bohème ...".

In 1938 a stamp was issued to commemorate the 250th anniversary of birth of Emanuel Swedenborg who is known as the founder of the sect "New Jerusalem." He visited the area of today's Czechoslovakia often and studied forestry in Bohemia. Mi 243–244.
